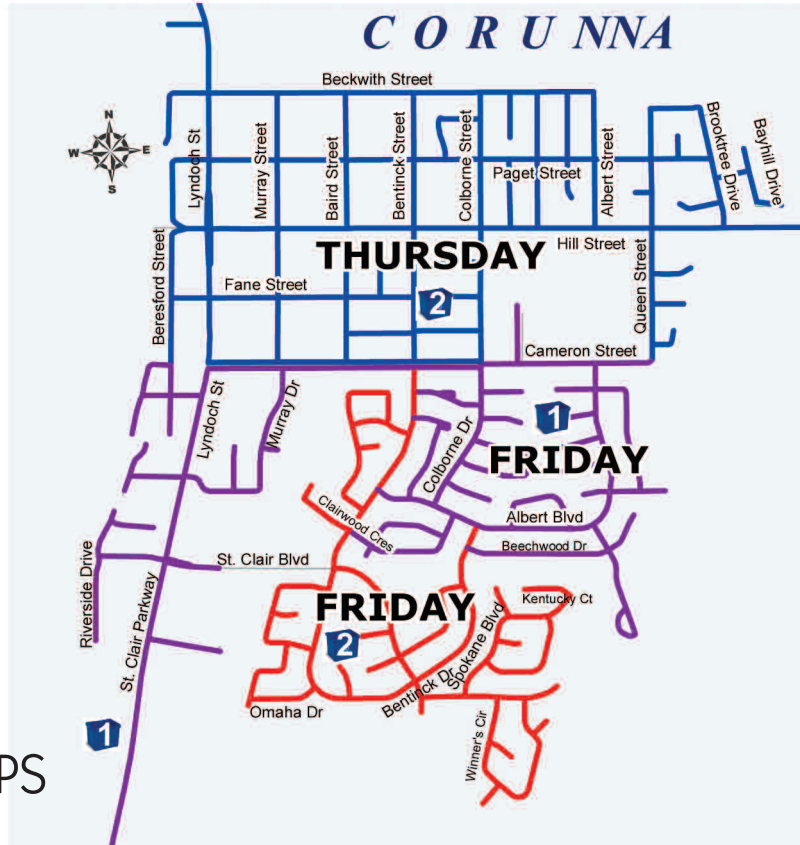

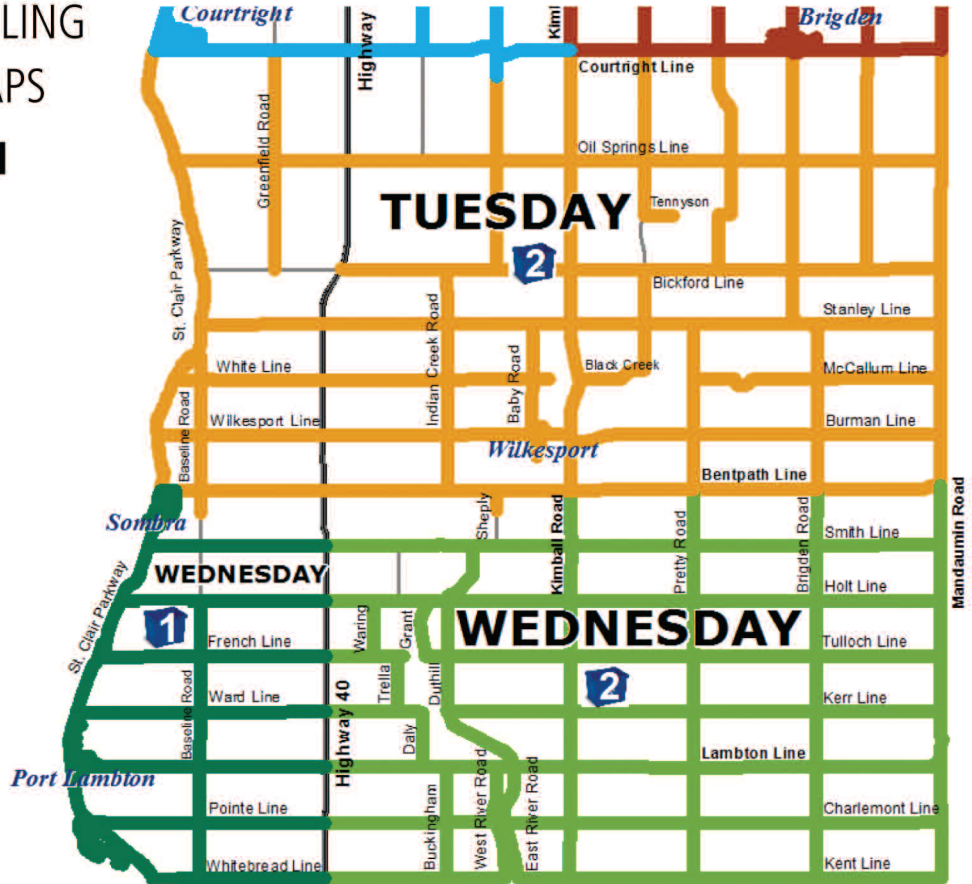

# Collection Rules

Missed collections are upsetting, but there is usually a reason why material was not collected as expected.

Ensure your materials are collected:

- **In acceptable containers**, plastic garbage bags, a container constructed of metal or plastic with external handles. Industrial totes and barrels will not be collected. Do not attach lid to container (zip tie, rope, etc.), cardboard containers are not acceptable for household waste.
- **Placed roadside by 7:00 a.m.** on scheduled day of collection (see maps page 1 & 2) within one metre of curb/road edge.
- **Household waste in containers** must be bagged securely, materials cannot be loose in container. This does not include recycling or yard waste.
- **Within the weight limit** of 23kg (50 lbs) and limited to six (6) items. Two (2) of six (6) items can be bulk, and will be recorded and picked up separately from regular waste.
- **Not hidden** behind a vehicle, snowbank, or other obstruction.
- **Free of prohibited content** (e.g. hazardous materials, needles, animal remains, vehicle parts, tree stumps, construction/renovation waste).
- **Place** waste containers and recycling **separate** from each other (do not mix).
- **Single sided collection of waste** will be completed on rural roads; **EXCEPT** for the following – Bentpath Line, Brigden Rd, Courtright Line, Kimball Rd, Lambton Line, Oil Springs Line, Petrolia Line and Stanley Line, these will continue to be collected on both sides of the road. For all other rural roads, place receptacles on the mailbox side of the road.
- **Non-recyclable item in Blue Box** (see page 15).
- **Household/yard waste in Blue Box.**
- **Recyclables not scheduled** for collection that particular week.
- **Not in an acceptable receptacle** (see page 15).

## Tree-cycle







Take your Christmas tree to the curb by **7:00 a.m.** on **January 9, 2023** and **January 8, 2024**, the special tree recycling day.

Remove all decorations, lights, wire, tree skirts, stands, tinsel, fake snow, and make sure the tree is not in a plastic bag. Place the tree at the curb on the collection day of January 9th, 2023.

Services are paid for by the **County of Lambton**. The waste management collection services are provided by **Clean Harbors Canada Inc.** located at 4090 Telfer Rd. This service is intended for **household hazardous waste only**.

## Materials accepted are:

Batteries, drain cleaner, oven cleaners, pesticides, rat poison, cleaning fluids, pharmaceuticals, pool chemicals, ammonia, bleach, aerosols, gasoline, paints, BBQ starter, oil, solvents and propane cylinders.

# Think Before You Flush!

Products labeled 'flushable' need to be disposed of in the garbage, NEVER down the toilet.



## Only Flush the Three 'P's PEE, POO and TOILET PAPER

### Your toilet is not a garbage can!

Items such as baby and personal wipes, diapers, hair, dental floss, condoms, feminine products, paper towels, medications, grease or fats from food can result in the back up of the sewer line into your home or create problems in the wastewater pumps and treatment plant.

## Your Sanitary Charge is Going Down the Drain!

The rising cost of sanitation is a result of many factors including operations and maintenance of facilities, infrastructure, treatment of waste water and meeting legislative requirements.

Every time you use water it has to go somewhere. Water from flushing, showering, laundry and the kitchen sink flows into the municipal sanitary sewage system and to the wastewater facility for regulated treatment and later released into the environment.

## Leaky Toilets Waste Liters of Water:

1. **Read your meter** before and after a two hour period when no water is being used. If meter read has gone up, there is a leak . . .
2. **Check toilet tank leaks** by adding food colouring to the tank. If leaking, colour will appear within 30 minutes. Check toilet for worn out, corroded or bent parts and replace. (flush when test is done, food colouring may stain tank).
3. **If toilet flush handle sticks** in the flush position, water will run constantly, replace or adjust the handle.

## Prevent FOG In Our Sewers (Fats, Oil & Grease)

**FOG** (fats, oil & grease) is the most common cause of sewer back-ups. **FOG** is a by-product of cooking and can be found in butter, margarine, salad dressing, gravies, sauces, lard, shortening, baking goods, meat fats and dairy. **DO NOT pour FOG down the sink, drain or toilet.**



## Water Flushing:

**Routinely Public Works will be flushing the fire hydrants connected to the St. Clair Township water system.**



During this routine maintenance procedure you may notice some discoloration using your taps, flushing toilets, doing laundry, etc. as some sediment may be drawn into your residence.

We recommend that you run the cold water tap for a few minutes or until the discoloration disappears. If discoloration of the water continues after 1 hour of normal use, please notify Public Works at **519-867-2993, option 3.**

# Yard Waste Collection 2023

The Township of St. Clair offers a yard waste/brush collection program for defined areas in order to reduce the amount of compostable material directed to the landfill site.

'Yard Waste' is collected separately from regular waste on a weekly basis in urbanized areas of the Township, collection begins at 7:00 am.

## What is Yard Waste?

**Yard waste includes the following:** grass, leaves, garden plants and loose hay (not baled).

**Not permitted:** woody stems from ornamental grasses and wood plants, kitchen waste, earth, stones, walnuts, pinecones, wood mulch, tree stumps, logs, body wood, large brush and whole shrubs with root ball attached.

Yard waste placed at the roadside for collection must be bagged in paper bags or open containers with handles, clearly marked with an 'X' on both sides, and must be free of all non-compostable material such as plastic, glass, metal, or other debris.

**Open containers DO NOT INCLUDE:** blue boxes or cardboard boxes. Containers must not exceed 23kg/50lb. Sticks/branches larger than a lead pencil **MUST** be bundled. Please do not put them in paper bags or loose in open containers. This could result in rejected collection.

Yard waste placed in regular garbage bags will **not be collected**. Yard waste in clear plastic bags will **not be collected** during yard waste collection dates.

## Collection Schedule:

Collection will be on Monday or Wednesday each week, depending on the service area. Spring Collection begins the week of April 24th and ends the week of June 19th. Fall Collection begins the week of October 16th and ends the week of November 20th.

**Pumpkins, gourds and squash can be disposed of in your Yard Waste, as long as they are not painted, have candle wax on them or they are decorated. If so, these items will go to regular landfill.**

# Brush Collection 2023

Small Brush Bundles will be collected on June 5th, June 26th and November 27th for Zone 1 and June 7th, June 28th and November 29th for Zone 2.

**Guidelines:** 4' maximum length, 1" maximum diameter, cut ends all in one direction, neat piles (not tangled) and tied and placed at the curb.

**These bundles can include:** woody ornamental grasses, woody plants, rose bushes, vines and cornstalks. Bundled brush must be tied with compostable material such as jute or twine, brush that is bundled with duct tape is **NOT** acceptable.

**Only Brush will be collected on these dates.**

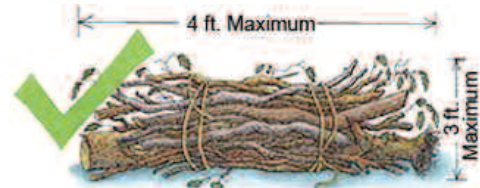

# Frozen Meters and Pipes

Preventative measures are best, but if you suspect your pipes are frozen check the following:

- **Most likely the pipes near an outside wall, door or window are frozen.** Start by opening a faucet near the frozen pipe to avoid a burst line when water starts flowing.
- **NEVER** use a blowtorch or open flame to thaw a line.
- **Begin by warming the pipes** using a blow dryer, heating pad or portable heater (do not place near flammable materials).
- **Once water starts flowing** allow a small stream of water to continue until heating is restored.
- **Eliminate drafts** and allow heat to circulate to avoid refreezing.

## Preventative

Frozen water meters and water pipes can stop your flow of water and may be costly to repair. Property owners are responsible for protecting water pipes and meters from damage.

- Eliminate cold drafts near water pipes
- Turn off service to external water taps
- Make frequent use of your water supply

**WHEN TEMPERATURES STAY BELOW FREEZING:**

- Give pipes a helping hand**  
If pipes run through cabinets or vanities, open the doors to let warmer room temperatures flow in.
- Keep water working**  
Keep water moving through the pipes by allowing a small trickle of water to run. The cost of the extra water is typically lower than the cost of repairing a broken pipe.

**BUT IF YOUR PIPES DO FREEZE:**

- Shut off the water immediately**  
Don't attempt to thaw pipes without turning off the main shut-off valve.
- Thaw pipes with warm air**  
You can melt the frozen water in the pipe by warming the air around it with a hair dryer or space heater. Be sure not to leave space heaters unattended and avoid the use of kerosene heaters or open flames.
- Be careful turning water back on**  
Once pipes are thawed, slowly turn the water back on and check pipes and joints for any cracks or leaks that might have been caused by freezing.

# Recycling Guide

Please ensure that materials are placed at the curb by 7:00 am.

The Township offers **Single Stream** (also known as 'fully commingled' or 'single-sort') recycling. **Single Stream** refers to a system in which all paper fibers, plastics, metals, and other containers are mixed in a collection truck, instead of being sorted by the resident into separate commodities (newspaper, paperboard, corrugated fiberboard, plastic, glass, etc.) and handled separately throughout the collection process. In **Single Stream**, both the collection and processing systems are designed to handle this 'fully commingled' mixture of recyclables, with materials being separated for reuse at a materials recovery facility.

**Recycling will only be collected in blue recycling bins. Industrial Totes will not be collected for residential. Blue Boxes and lids are available for purchase at the St. Clair Civic Centre Public Works.**




## Food, Beverage & Liquid Containers

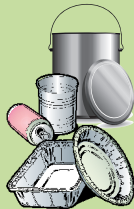
### Clear & Coloured Glass:




- Clear or coloured food jars (rinsed)
- Beverage containers
- Pop bottles

 **NOT INCLUDED:** light bulbs of any type, no mirror, window or sheet glass, no drinking glasses, no ceramics (plates, mugs, Pyrex®), no broken glass.

### Metal & Aluminum Cans:



- Pop, beer, juice, food & pet cans (rinsed)
- Metal paint cans (empty, dry, lids removed)
- Aluminum foil wrap, aluminum plates & trays (cleaned of any food or food residue)

 **NOT INCLUDED:** Metal pots, coat hangers, oil filters, sheet metal and toys, aerosol cans, auto parts, cutlery, propane & helium containers.

## Paper & Fibre Products

### Newspapers:




- All newspapers and all flyers (coloured and black and white)

### Fibre or Paper Products:



- Items that are **100% paper**, such as computer paper, office paper, envelopes (white or coloured), ad mail, bills, statements, flyers, etc.
- Paperback books, catalogues, telephone books, magazines
- Fast food take-out trays
- Milk & juice cartons (rinsed)

 **NOT INCLUDED:** Carbon paper, hard cover books, blueprint paper, facial tissue, toilet paper, paper towels, laminated paper, artwork, paper with foreign material attached, cards with foil, plastic, ribbon or lamination.

## Plastics:



- All plastic containers coded with #1, #2, #4, #5, #6, and #7 symbol
- Liquor, pop, water bottles, K-cups (emptied & rinsed)
- Dish soap, juice, vinegar bottles, bleach bottles
- Mouthwash & cooking oil bottles
- Yogurt, margarine, peanut butter containers
- Clean trays & grocery clam shell containers (rinsed)
- Prescription bottles (over 2 inches)



**NOT INCLUDED:** Plastic bags, toys, containers without markings on bottom, motor oil containers, hanging flower containers, flower pots, trays & planters, blister packaging, plastic wrap around water bottles & pop/beverage cases.

## Cardboard & Boxboard:



- **Boxboard** items such as tissue box, cereal boxes, shoe boxes, paper towel centre cores
- **Cardboard** flattened, tied in bundles no larger than 30" x 30" x 8"
- **Paper** egg cartons
- **Milk cartons, juice boxes, tetra packs**
- **Laundry detergent, packing boxes**
- **Fast food drink containers** (without lid & straw)
- **Clean pizza boxes**



**NOT INCLUDED:** Boxes containing any food or food residue i.e. pizza box with toppings stuck to lid, waxy cardboard.

## Thank you for your continued support of our Waste Reduction Program.

Do not overfill Bins, loose is better and keeps items from getting stuck in the box. If ice/snow are in Blue Boxes, it can make them too heavy to collect.

**Styrofoam™ is NOT collected with recycling in St. Clair Township. Put out with waste.**
