Thank you for being an active part of that effort. If you have any questions or need support, our team is always here to help.







# Collection Rules

Missed collections are upsetting, but there is usually a reason why material was not collected as expected.

## Ensure materials collected are:

- **In acceptable containers**, plastic garbage bags, a container constructed of metal or plastic with external handles. Industrial totes and barrels will not be collected (zip tie, rope, etc.) cardboard containers are not acceptable for household waste.
- **Placed roadside by 7:00am** on scheduled day of collection (see maps on page 1 and 2) within one meter of curb/road edge.
- **Household waste in containers** must be bagged securely, materials cannot be loose in container. This does not include recycling or yard waste.
- **Within the weight limit** of 23kg (50 lbs) and limited to six(6) items. Two (2) of six (6) items can be bulk, and will be recorded and picked up separately from regular waste.
- **Not hidden** behind a vehicle, snowbank, or other obstruction.
- **Free of prohibited content** (e.g. hazardous materials, needles, animal remains, vehicle parts, tree stumps, construction/renovation waste).
- **Separate.** Place waste and recycling containers separate from each other.
- **Single sided collection** of waste will be completed on rural roads; **EXCEPT** for the following: Bentpath Line, Brigden Rd, Courtright Line, Kimball Rd, Lambton Line, Oil Springs Line, Petrolia Line and Stanley Line, these will continue to be collected on both sides of the road. For all other rural roads, place receptacles on the mailbox side of the road.
- **Placed in the correct containers.** Non-recyclable items, household waste and yard waste should not be in the Blue box. (see page 15 & 16)
- **Placed to the curb on scheduled date**



## Tree-cycle

Take your Christmas tree to the curb by **7:00am** on **January 5, 2026** the special tree recycling day.

Remove all decorations, lights, wire, tree skirts, stands, tinsel, fake snow, and make sure the tree is not in a plastic bag.

## Your Sanitary Charge is Going Down the Drain!

The rising cost of sanitation is a result of many factors including operations and maintenance of facilities, infrastructure, treatment of waste water and meeting legislative requirements.

Every time you use water it has to go somewhere. Water from flushing, showering, laundry and the kitchen sink flows into the municipal sanitary sewage system and to the wastewater facility for regulated treatment and later released to the environment.

## Leaky Toilets Waste Litres of Water

1. Read your meter before and after a two hour period when no water is being used. If meter read has gone up, there is a leak.
2. Check toilet tank leaks by adding food colouring to the tank. If leaking, colour will appear within 30 minutes. Check toilet for worn out, corroded or bent parts and replace. (flush when test is done, food colouring may stain tank).
3. If toilet flush handle sticks in the flush position, water will run constantly, replace or adjust the handle.

# Think Before You Flush!

**Though products are labeled 'flushable' they are not. These products need to be disposed of in the garbage, NEVER down the toilet.**



## Only Flush the Three P's PEE, POO and TOILET PAPER

**Your toilet is not a garbage can!** Items such as baby and personal wipes, diapers, hair, dental floss, condoms, feminine products, paper towels, medications, grease or fats from food can result in the back up of the sewer line into your home or create problems in the wastewater pumps and treatment plants.

## Prevent FOG in Our Sewers (Fats, Oils & Grease)

FOG (fats, oil and grease) is the most common cause of sewer back-ups. FOG is a by-product of cooking and can be found in butter, margarine, salad dressing, gravies, sauces, lard, shortening, baking goods, meat fats and dairy. **DO NOT pour FOG down the sink, drain or toilet.**



## Water Flushing

**Routinely Public Works will be flushing the fire hydrants connected to the St. Clair Township water system.**

During this routine maintenance procedure you may notice some discoloration when using your taps, flushing toilets, doing laundry, etc as some sediment may be drawn into your residence.



We recommend that you run the cold water tap for a few minutes or until the discoloration disappears. If discoloration of the water continues after 1 hour of normal use, please notify Public Works at **519-867-2993, option 3**

Services are paid for by the **County of Lambton 1-800-809-0301**. The waste management collection services are provided by **Clean Harbors Canada Inc.** located at 4090 Telfer Rd. This service is intended for **household hazardous waste only**.

## Materials accepted are:

Batteries, drain cleaner, oven cleaners, pesticides, rat poison, cleaning fluids, pharmaceuticals, pool chemicals, ammonia, bleach, aerosols, gasoline, paints, BBQ starter, oil, solvents and propane cylinders.

# Yard Waste Collection 2026

The Township of St. Clair offers a yard waste collection program for defined areas in order to reduce the amount of compostable material directed to the landfill site.

'Yard Waste' is collected separately from regular waste in urbanized areas of the Township, collection begins at 7:00am

## What Is Yard Waste?

**Yard waste includes the following:** grass, leaves, garden plants and loose hay (not baled)

**Not permitted:** Sticks and branches, woody stems from ornamental grasses and wood plants, kitchen waste, earth, stones, walnuts, pinecones, wood mulch, tree stumps, logs, body wood, large brush and whole shrubs with root ball attached.

Yard waste placed at the roadside for collection must be bagged in paper bags or open containers with handles, clearly marked with an 'X' on both sides, and must be free of all non-compostable material such as plastic, glass, metal, or other debris.

**Open containers DO NOT INCLUDE:** blue boxes or cardboard boxes. Containers must not exceed 23kg/50lb.

Yard waste placed in regular garbage bags will **not be collected**. Yard waste in clear plastic bags will **not be collected** during yard waste collection dates.

## Collection Schedule:

Collection will be on Monday or Wednesday, depending on the service area. Spring Collection begins the week of April 20th and ends the week of June 15th. Fall Collection begins the week of October 19th and ends the week of November 16th.

- Curran St. and Froomfield Area
- Brigden, Courtright, Mooretown, Port Lambton
- Sombra Village, Wilkesport, Leeland Gardens

### Wednesday: (Zone 2)

- Corunna - everything east of Lyndoch St.



Pumpkins, gourds and squash can be disposed of in your Yard Waste, as long as they are not painted, have candle wax on them or they are decorated. If so, these items will go to regular landfill.



# Frozen Meters and Pipes

Preventative measures are best, but if you suspect your pipes are frozen check the following:

- **Most likely the pipes near an outside wall, door or window are frozen.** Start by opening a faucet near the frozen pipe to avoid a burst line when water starts flowing.
- **NEVER** use a blowtorch or open flame to thaw a line.
- **Begin by warming the pipes** using a blow dryer, heating pad or portable heater (do not place near flammable materials).
- **Once water starts flowing** allow a small stream of water to continue until heating is resolved.
- **Eliminate drafts** and allow heat to circulate to avoid refreezing.

## Preventative

**Frozen water meters and water pipes can stop your flow of water and may be costly to repair. Property owners are responsible for protecting water pipes and meters from damage.**

- Eliminate cold drafts near water pipes
- Turn off service to external water taps
- Make frequent use of your water

### WHEN TEMPERATURES STAY BELOW FREEZING:



#### Give pipes a helping hand

If pipes run through cabinets or vanities, open the doors to let warmer room temperatures flow in.



#### Keep water working

Keep water moving through the pipes by allowing a small trickle of water to run. The cost of the extra water is typically lower than the cost of repairing a broken pipe.

### BUT IF YOUR PIPES DO FREEZE:



#### Shut off the water immediately

Don't attempt to thaw pipes without turning off the main shut-off valve.



#### Thaw pipes with warm air

You can melt the frozen water in the pipe by warming the air around it with a hair dryer or space heater. Be sure not to leave space heaters unattended and avoid the use of kerosene heaters or open flames.



#### Be careful turning water back on

Once pipes are thawed, slowly turn the water back on and check pipes and joints for any cracks or leaks that might have been caused by freezing.

# Recycling Guide



**Please ensure that materials are placed at the curb by 7:00 am.**

The Township offers **Single Stream** (also known as 'fully commingled' or 'single-sort') recycling. **Single Stream** refers to a system in which all paper fibers, plastics, metals, and other containers are mixed in a collection truck, instead of being sorted by the resident into separate commodities (newspaper, paperboard, corrugated fiberboard, plastic, glass, etc.) and handled separately throughout the collection process. In **Single Stream**, both the collection and processing systems are designed to handle this 'full commingled' mixture of recyclables, with materials being separated for reuse at a materials recovery facility.

## Glass Containers

*Must be empty with lids off and free from residues*



**Clear and Coloured Glass:** food containers, jars and bottles, cosmetic containers, spice bottles, oil and vinegar bottles, non-alcoholic glass beverage containers.



**DO NOT** include alcoholic beverage containers.

## Metal

*Must be empty and free from residues*



**Metal Containers:** food cans, metal lids, cookie, coffee and tea tins, beverage cans.

**Aluminum (Foil and Trays):** aluminum foil, pie plates, frozen food trays. Foil must be balled up.

**Aerosol Containers:** food spray, hairspray, air fresheners, shaving cream and deodorant.



**DO NOT** include alcoholic beverage containers.

## Paper and Fibre

*Must be empty and free from residues*

**Cardboard Boxes:** pizza boxes, direct mail boxes, moving boxes, shoe boxes. Must be flattened, no larger than 60 cm x 60 cm.

**Boxboard:** cereal boxes, tissue boxes, egg cartons, rolls from toilet paper and paper towels. Must be flattened.

**Paper Laminate Packaging:** pet food bags, food service paper bags and plates.

**Paper Laminate Containers:** spiral cans, cookie dough package, ice cream containers, and hot and cold beverage cups. Please remove lid.

**Cartons:** beverage cartons, juice and milk cartons, coffee creamers and sugar cartons, soup and sauce cartons. Please leave lid on.



**DO NOT** include alcoholic beverage containers.

## Plastic and Foam

Must be empty, lids on  
and free from residues

**Hard Plastic Containers:** laundry detergent and household cleaner jugs, shampoo, bodywash, salad dressing, condiment, dish soap, mouth wash bottles, plastic beverage bottles.

**PET Plastic Packaging and Containers:** food trays, salad, yogurt, peanut butter, bakery and egg containers, plastic cups, plastic tubs and lids.

**Tubes:** toothpaste tubes, deodorant, hand cream tubes.

**Small Item Plastic Packaging:** hand sanitizer bottles, medication bottles, blister packs, and plant pots.



**Flexible Plastic Packaging:** bags used for dry cleaning, bread, newspapers and flyers. Overwrap (*paper towel and toilet paper, beverage containers*). Coffee bags or deli pouches, chip bags, bubble wrap, snack wrappers, cereal liner bags, plastic gift bags.

**Foam Packaging:** meat trays, takeout containers, cups, plates, bowls, foam packaging for products. Must remove film wrap and absorbent pads.

 DO NOT include alcoholic beverage containers.

Recycling will only be collected in blue recycling bins. Visit [www.circularmaterials.ca/resident-communities/township-of-st-clair/](http://www.circularmaterials.ca/resident-communities/township-of-st-clair/). Industrial Totes **will not** be collected for residential. Blue Boxes and lids are available for purchase at the St. Clair Civic Centre Public Works. ## Paper



**Paper:** any colour. Includes flour bags, prescription bags, paper produce bags. Notepads, white or coloured loose paper, file folders, other printed materials. Community newspapers, flyers, brochures and magazines. Greeting cards and envelopes, gift boxes. All products must be empty, shredded paper should be placed in a tied clear plastic bag, removed from plastic bags used as packaging, and any elastic bands removed.

 DO NOT include soft or hard covered books or novels
